IIM Ranchi has completed the Summer Placements for its MBA and MBA-HR Programmes (2019-21). The season has witnessed participation by 125 companies for 281 students (207 and 74 in MBA) and MBA-HR respectively). The average stipend for the MBA Batch has an increment of 5.36 per cent from the previous year and stands at INR 95,696/. Average stipend for the MBA-HR Batch is INR 1,00,171/, increasing by 5.27 per cent. The average stipend for the top 25 percentile of the MBA Batch is INR 1,92,509/ and that for the

FIELD Visit

FEBRUARY 6TH, 2020

Indian Institute of Management (IIM)

Ranchi organized an industrial visit of the Patratu Plant of Jindal Steel & Power Ltd. (JSPL) for the students of MBA HR Batch of 2018-20. The primary purpose of the visit

was to understand the various plant-level issues of industrial relations and the prevalent human resource practices of the company. It also intended to give students a flavour of a factory set-up and how a manufacturing establishment manages its workforce. This day-long visit was coordinated by Dr. Piyali Ghosh, Assistant Professor (OB/HR Area of the Institute).

At the beginning of the visit, the team of students was made familiar with the company through a video that highlighted the vision of JSPL, the growth trajectory of the company and the various social endeavours it takes up. In his interaction session, Mr. R.N. Prasad, Head HR & ES at the Plant, gave interesting insights to the elucidated $_{\mathrm{He}}$ that students. expectations of workers are changing with increase in automation. Thus it becomes crucial for the HR function to adopt a proactive approach. Developing a focused, motivated, dedicated, and a 'no excuses' way of working is

the major soft area that an HR manager must focus on. A positive mind-set, attitude, integrity, passion, and loyalty are the five biggest assets a

good HR manager must develop among employees. This apart, Mr. Prasad explained in detail the relevant labour laws applicable to the Plant. Students were thereafter taken on a tour to the Steel Rolling Unit of the Plant, wherein the shop-floor staff explained the entire process of steel rolling and also demonstrated the necessary safety measures undertaken.

The visit to the Patratu Plant of JSPL was indeed a great exposure for the students to the soft and hard aspects of HR in a manufacturing establishment. Deliberations on plant-level industrial relations and related policy matters made the subject matter more relatable to the students.

The program ended with the felicitation of the triad by Mr. Arimardan Singh, ADG, PIB Ranchi.

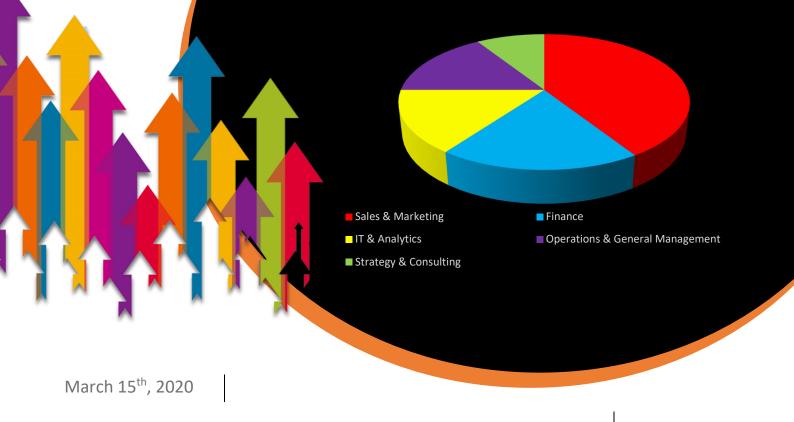
