Ranchi: The Union minister of state for education, Annapurna Devi, on Monday urged the students of Indian Institute of Management (IIM),

Addressing the students at Birsa Munda Centre for Tribal Affairs (BMCTA), she said, "Students of IIM can become mentors for those school as well as college students and guide them in planning their future. A majority of pupils are often confused regarding what to

She further said that BMCTA could take up lectures, short-term courses and research activities on tribal issues.

IIM-R director Shailendra Singh requested the minister to take steps for granting Rs 150 crore to help the institute build additional infrastructure. He added that presently, IIM can accommodate 666 students in its hostels but in the coming years, its strength would increase to 1,500. He also mentioned the various activities undertaken by IIM-R under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and Van Dhan Vikas Kendra. Praveen Shanker Pandya, the chairman of the board of governors at IIM-R, spoke about the development of IIM Ranchi's new campus. Ranchi mayor Asha Lakra attended the function as well.
