Youth needs to take risks, says Jayant Sinha at IIM-R event

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RANCHI: Students pursing management courses from Indian Institute of Management, Ranchi (IIM-R) preferred to know more about the challenges faced by the country than management tips from Union minister of state for civil aviation Jayant Sinha on Saturday.

It was an induction programme of the 2018-20 batch with the minister at Mayuri Hall, CMPDI and the IIM-R students made Sinha feel proud with their prudence.

Their inquisitiveness included whether technology is withering job avenues, how it is helpful in farming and improving national economy and to which extent imbibing western model is justified, while some asked the neglect of the northeastern states.

On agriculture he laid stress on interface between farmers

and industries and underlined the Narendra Modi government's initiative to double the farmer's income by 2022.

"Collaborating with massive job creating frontiers such as ICICI, HDFC and aviation sector will give rise to job opportunities," he said adding that the government needs to jumpstart in the market ecosystem providing adequate funding.

For better understanding how to balance trade and human development based on race, history of mankind, he recommended few books to the students as well.

Encouraging the idea of entre-

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preneurship he said that the youth needs to take risks and rise with idea for their individual contribution to the country's growth. One must not fear competitions and take risks as it will help them improve, he said.
