Ranchi: Retired major-general P.K. Sehgal, the former head of Army Air Defence College, on Sunday asked the new batch of IIM-Ranchi to develop and use their talent to bring about a positive change in the country.

A total of 185 students have been enrolled for post graduate diploma in management while 65 students have been selected for post graduate diploma in human resource management for 2018-19.

Sengal, who was addressing the students at CMPDI Auditorium, said India had an enviable talent pool and would surpass China in terms of technology and skills in the next 10 years.

"Kuch acchaa kar guzarne ka anokha pagalpan paida kijiye. Aap aaj nahin kal ko dhyan mein rakh kar apne skill ko develop kijiye (Create a passion for doing something good. Keep the future in mind and develop your skills)," he said.

He cited the example of his elder daughter who became the vice-president of a US-based company that had around 40,000 employees.

CMPDI chairman and MD Shekhar Sharan, who had enrolled himself at IIM-Ranchi to study finance, shared his experience. "I had joined IIM around 2013 but could not attend many classes as the Coalgade scam had just been unearthed. I was preoccupied with assisting agencies in the probe. It was one of the toughest days of my academic life, but I was supported by my teachers."
