## Overnight parking of flights at Birsa Munda airport soon

Ranchi: The Birsa Munda International Airport in Ranchi will soon have overnight facilities for parking of aircraft within the next few months. The announcement was made by Union minister of state for civil aviation Jayant Sinha during an interaction with the new batch of students at IIM Ranchi on Saturday. Sinha said, "The maximum traffic of passengers is always early in the morning and outbound flights from Ranchi are missing out on that because there are no facilities to park the airplanes here overnight. He added, "This will definitely boost the traffic of flyers from Ranchi and also bring new airlines with connectivity to more cities across the country and bevond."

Sinha also reminisces from his days as a student and also

All the seven northeastern states will soon have airports to improve the connectivity in these areas. Already the flower supply business of orchid farmers have been boosted through better air connectivity. From fruits to local produce, these states are creating a market for their products across the nation and even in international locations."
